## Saginaw Area Transportation Agency Certified Resolution to Support Michigan Department of Transportation State Targets for Safety Performance Measures

**WHEREAS**, the Saginaw Area Transportation Agency has been designated by the Governor of the State of Michigan as the Metropolitan Planning Organization responsible for the comprehensive, continuing, and cooperative transportation planning process for the entirety of Saginaw County, except for Tittabawassee Township.; and

WHEREAS, the Highway Safety Improvement Program final (23 CRF Part 490) requires States to set targets for five safety performance measures by August 31, 2022, and

WHEREAS, the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) has established targets for five performance measures based on five year rolling averages for:

- 1. Number of Fatalities,
- 2. Rate of Fatalities per 100 million Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT),
- 3. Number of Serious Injuries,
- 4. Rate of Serious Injuries per 100 million VMT, and
- 5. Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Non-Motorized Serious Injuries; and

WHEREAS, the MDOT coordinated the establishment of safety target with the 14 Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) in Michigan through the monthly Target Coordination Meetings and through discussions at various meetings of the Michigan Transportation Planning Association, and

**WHEREAS**, the MDOT has officially adopted the state safety targets in the Highway Improvement Program annual report dated August 31, 2022, as shown in the table below.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Saginaw Area Transportation Agency will plan and program projects that contribute to the accomplishment of state safety targets.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Saginaw Area Transportation Agency has agreed to support the MDOT's state safety targets shown below for calendar year 2024,
